IKEA OPEN DAYS

From 8am on Saturday 18th of April, an excited queue began to form outside the Civic Centre in Ballymun for the first of the IKEA Recruitment Open Days. At 10am, a queue of 200 people was welcomed by 30 IKEA co-workers to the sounds of ABBA. People hurriedly proceeded to the stands to find out as much information as they could about working at IKEA.

Media interest was strong and soon after 98FM, Newstalk Radio, RTE News, The Evening Herald and the Sunday Tribune arrived on the scene to talk to visitors and co-workers.

A total of 3,500 people were welcomed over the two days. The atmosphere was fantastic and was further qualified by vox pops on 98FM from visitors, one in particular who said 'If IKEA want to promote themselves as a great place to work, they have done exactly that'.

Axis opened its doors just eight short years ago, in 2001, and ticket sales have steadily been on the rise. This can be attributed to consistently low-ticket prices, which make high quality, live entertainment an affordable night out. Keeping ticket prices reasonable, particularly in a time of recession, is important to axis Director and CEO, Ray Yeates.
